



Data Protection Declaration for the Recording of Video Conference at the AFLOW School for Materials Discovery 2021

For what purpose will personal data be processed?

The personal data will be processed to make the video conference recording of the AFLOW School for Materials and Discovery 2021 available on websites for those in academia and beyond. The event is scheduled to take place online from September 6-10, 2021.

Who is responsible for data processing and who can data subjects contact?

What is the legal basis for the processing of personal data?

The legal basis for the processing of data for the aforementioned purposes is Art. 6 para. 1 and subpara. 1 lit. a GDPR (Consent).

What personal data will be processed?

Only the personal data resulting from your voice, the external characteristics of your person, the environment and the content of the recordings are processed. (The voice, as well as the name of the person responsible for the content, will only be published with consent. If consent is not given, a pseudonym is used that does not allow any conclusions to be drawn about the person or the content is spoken by a third person.)

For how long is personal data processed/stored?

The collection of data is person-related. This means that conclusions can be drawn about specific individuals based on the data collected. The personal data collected and published as part of this survey will be deleted as soon as this is objected to. The video recordings alongside the data published are uploaded to the internet on the servers of TU Dresden, the website of AFLOW Consortium (e.g. Http://aflow.org/) and the Videocampus Saxony (https://videocampus.sachsen.de/) and are therefore available as long as this information can be retrieved from the internet.

What personal data will be transferred to third parties?

Unless stipulated otherwise by law or unless you have given your express consent in individual cases, no personal data will be transferred to third parties.

Is person-related data published?

The video recordings and the resulting data are available on the internet on the servers of TU Dresden, the websites of the AFLOW Consortium (e.g. Http://aflow.org/) and the Videocampus Saxony (https://videocampus.sachsen.de/). The publication of the name can be objected to or, if desired, replaced by a pseudonym, so that no inference can be made about the person in question.

What are the general basic rights of data subjects?

1) Voluntariness and revocation according to Art. 7 para. 3 GDPR

Consent is voluntary. Consent to the processing of personal data may be revoked at any time pursuant to Art. 7 para. 3 GDPR. The personal data of the person in question will no longer be processed. The legality of the processing carried out on the basis of consent until revocation remains unaffected.

2) Right to information (Art. 15 GDPR)

Data subjects have the right to obtain information on the data processed concerning them, as well as the possible recipients of this data, at any time. You are entitled to a reply within one month of the responsible party for the data processing receiving your request for information.

3) Right to correction, deletion and limitation (Art. 16 - 18 GDPR)

Data subjects can contact TU Dresden at any time to demand the correction, deletion or the restriction of

processing of their personal data.

4) Right to the transferability of data (Art. 20 GDPR)

Data subjects can request that the responsible party for the data processing transfers their data in a machinereadable format. Alternatively, you can request the direct transfer of your personal data to a different responsible party, insofar as this is possible.

5) Right of Appeal (Art. 77 GDPR)

Data subjects can at any time contact TU Dresden's Data Protection Officer and, in (see above), the case of a complaint pursuant to Art. 77 DSGVO, the responsible supervisory authority for data protection. The responsible authority is:

<u>Note:</u> To claim your rights, it is sufficient to notify Florian Pump in writing (letter, email, or fax) (see above). However, the rights can only be exercised if the data processed allows for the identification of a natural person.
